## Changes to Newsletter

As West Penn Baseball Prospects continues to evolve and learn from its successes and mistakes, we are making a change in our newsletter effective with the current issue. In each of our past issues the principal newsletter content has been prospect listings and prospect biographies. This results in prospect biographical information being "scattered" through various issues, making it difficult for a college coach, or any other interested party, to sit down and read about our prospects.

A couple of months ago we added a prospect list and prospect bios to our website. This accomplished a couple of things. First, it put all the prospect information in one place, making it much easier to review information about Western Pennsylvania prospects. Second, it allowed us to update prospect information without having to publish a newsletter. Our practice is to update the prospect listings and bios on a monthly basis. This means that a newly identified prospect is no more than 30 days from appearing in our listings and being available to college coaches.

To get on-line access to the prospect information, follow these steps:

1. Go to our website at [www.wpabaseball.com](http://www.wpabaseball.com)
2. Go the left side of the home page and click on "Online Prospect Data Base"
3. Click on either the "Prospect List" or "Prospect Bios" to get prospect information.

## Changes to Newsletter (cont'd)

The next logical step in this change is not to show the prospect information in our newsletters at all. Effective with this issue, we are making this change. The newsletter will now be used for "news items" and other current happenings.

If you have an opinion (pro or con) on the changes we have made, please let me know.

## Possible Player Ratings Changes

Another change being considered by West Penn Baseball Prospects is the elimination of player ratings. We ask high school and summer league coaches for player ratings when they provide player recommendations. By their nature, player ratings are very subjective. This subjectivity becomes even pronounced, and the issue of lack of consistency is added, when the ratings are being prepared by a large number of coaches with different experiences, perspectives and philosophies. In addition, we don't have ratings for all players included in our prospect listing. In some cases, this is because the coach is not comfortable providing a rating and in other cases because we have not received a response from a coach.

All the above has made us reconsider the use of ratings.

We have surveyed a number of college coaches to see how useful they find the ratings. While some do find the ratings useful, the majority

of coaches seem to prefer the elimination of the ratings. If we eliminate the ratings, we would continue to list prospects by their graduation year and then sort them by their principal position.

If you have an opinion on this subject please let me know. I will be making a decision on the ratings by the end of December.

### Team Profile: Allegheny Pirates

The Allegheny Pirates are generally regarded as the premier fall league team in Western Pennsylvania for high school players. The Pirates were formed eight years ago with the goal of helping local high school players move onto the next level of competition.

Under the leadership of Fred Albert, the Pirates have been very successful in accomplishing their mission. Going into this season 128 players had played for the Pirates with 104 of those moving on to play college baseball. 22 of those players have also been drafted by a Major League team.

The Pirates play both locally and take the road to such locales as Raleigh (NC), Fairfax (VA), Canton (OH), Norfolk (VA), Baltimore (MD) and Allentown (PA).

### Bulldogs Repeat as NABF Champions

The Diamond Dog Bulldogs, a Pittsburgh-area team based in West Mifflin, captured its second consecutive National Amateur Baseball Federation Championship. They are the first back-to-back champion in the NABF's 61 year history. The Bulldogs are managed by Mike Kosko and assistant Chip Hunter. Kosko is a part owner of the Diamond Dogs Academy of Baseball/Softball (412-462-1466) and an associate scout with the Kansas City Royals.

Formerly known as Batting Practice, the Bulldogs won their regional in Struthers, OH to advance to the 18 and under nationals held in Jackson, Mississippi. This is the 4th consecutive year they have advanced to the World Series.

The national tournament consisted of 10 teams divided into two pools. The two best clubs in each pool advance to semifinal action.

The Bulldogs opened their tournament run by beating the Grand Slam Diamonds of Delaware, 8-3. The opening win was followed by a 4-3 loss to the Winning Inning of Florida.

The Bulldogs rebounded to qualify for the semi-final round with a 6-3 defeat of the Indiana Bulls and a 6-5 victory over the Norwood Blues.

Anthony Rossi (Peters Township and University of Pittsburgh) pitched a complete game in beating the Bulls. Against the Blues, the Bulldogs weathered three rain delays and stormed back from a 5-1 deficit in the bottom of the 7th to win. With one out in the bottom of the seventh, the Bulldogs strung together seven hits, including a hit by Jimmy Gallagher, (Peters Township and Duke) that scored Andy Goff (Mt. Lebanon and Wake Forest) with the game winning run.

The Bulldogs easily won the opening game of the semi-final round, smashing the Jackson 96ers, 13-4. In the championship game, they edged the Indiana Bulls in a rematch by a 7-6 score. The Bulldogs needed extra innings in the title game, with Gallagher playing the hero one more time as he tagged a sacrifice fly to right to score Shayne Busti (Carmichaels and Penn State) with the winning run in the eighth inning.

The Bulldogs appeared to have the game sewn up, leading 6-3, with two outs in the top of the seventh. The Bulls rallied to tie the game, however, and send the contest into extra innings as the Bulldogs stranded runners on second and third in the bottom of the seventh.

After starting pitcher Eric Drobotij (Mt. Lebanon and Mercyhurst) put down the Bulls in order in the top of the eighth, the Bulldogs rallied for the win. Busti singled, Blake Jurena (North Allegheny – 2005) reached first on a bunt and Goff walked to load the bases for Gallagher.

Drobotij earned MVP honors in the tournament. He pitched two complete games in the championship round, and was the winning pitcher in both.

Gallagher, Goff and Drobotij played on both championship teams along with Clint Seymour (Mt. Lebanon and Eastern Kentucky) and Mike Schmidt (Bethel Park and West Virginia).

Other members of the squad included Craig Misiewicz (Bethel Park and Allegheny), Matt Charlton (Bethel Park and Lehigh), Eric Morrison (Bethel Park and Duquesne), Aaron Janusey (Peters Township and Duquesne), Mike Gielarowski (Chartiers Valley – 2005), Gary Bucuren (Ambridge – 2005), Sam Clyde (Southside Beaver and Cleveland State) and Tony Kostelnik (West Mifflin and Point Park).

The Bulldogs placed several players on the All-Tournament Team including Bucuren, Charlton, Drobotij, Goff, Janusey and Seymour.
